## History



FPS traces its roots back to **1789** when six night watchmen were charged to protect Federal facilities.

FPS was formally established by the General Services Administration (GSA) in **1971**.


FPS was transferred from GSA to the Department of Homeland Security, ICE, on **March 1, 2003**, in accordance with the Homeland Security Act of 2002.



## Facts



FPS is responsible for providing law enforcement and security services to **8,800 +/-** GSA controlled facilities nationwide.





## Activities

---



- Provides a visible uniformed police presence
- Manage approximately 15,000 armed contract security guards at Federal facilities.
- Responds to criminal incidents and other emergencies
- Provides 24/7 alarm monitoring
- Purchases, installs, and monitors security countermeasures
- Conducts building vulnerability and security assessments.
- Intelligence gathering and sharing
- Coordinates occupant emergency plan development
- Conducts crime prevention & security awareness sessions.



## FPS Specialized Capabilities




- Provides police emergency and special security services during natural disasters, major civil disturbances, and terrorist and criminal actions.
- Provides operational and law enforcement support for special events such as the FTAA, G8, DNC, RNC, and Presidential Inaugurals.
- Coordinates with state and local police and HAZMAT officers for the purposes of intelligence sharing, as well as interoperability of first responder equipment and backup police support.
- Provides canine, HAZMAT trained first responders, and special response teams to Federal facilities.
- Serve as the lead agency for the Government Facilities Sector under the National Infrastructure Protection Plan

# Building Security Assessment (BSA) Process



# Countermeasure Categories



FPS and GSA classifies countermeasures into three main categories:

- Security Fixtures [GSA]
- Security Equipment [FPS]
- Contract Security Guards [FPS]



## Security Fixtures [GSA]



A physical security measure that is part of, or attached and not easily removable from, the building.




- Vehicular barriers - bollards, gates, pop-up/arm gates
- Doors, locks, garage doors, access control
- Parking lot fencing and gates
- Guard booths
- Blast-resistant windows



## Security Equipment [FPS]



Security-related items that are not part of a building and are easily removed from the building.



- Closed-Circuit Television (CCTV) Systems
- X-ray Machines
- Magnetometers
- Intrusion/Duress Alarm Systems

# Contract Security Guard [FPS]



A human capital resource used to reduce facility risks.

- ✓ Total Number of Physical Security Contracts : 2,107



The top 3 PSC codes comprise **\$924,967,419** which totals almost **92%** of the Physical Security spend.
