

In February, 2021, the U.S. General Services Administration’s Integrated Award Environment hosted an online Stakeholder Forum webinar. With almost 1,100 participants, the program focused on an introduction to the new design of beta.SAM.gov, which will launch on April 26, 2021. We received nearly 200 questions from the participants on a variety of topics. Our subject matter experts have provided answers below. Remember, you can search the Federal Service Desk knowledge base for additional videos and frequently asked questions or get help with technical issues at FSD.gov.

During this transition will we still be able to access SAM as we currently do or will there be a new site to access with new passwords?4	If you enter SAM.gov after the transition in May, you will be redirected to the new site. You can continue to login using your SAM.gov login password.
As a subcontractor will we be allowed to see what subcontracting opportunities the primes report that they have with this new IAE?	The upcoming changes do not impact contract or subcontract reporting functionality.
Will we be going through the annual service inventory reporting that was originally on SAM.gov?	The service inventory reporting will be moved to beta.SAM.gov . As part of the SAM.gov integration in May. No change to the reporting requirements is planned.
I still use FPDS New Gen for historical data information on our DoD contracts. It is so easy to use and easy to pull into Excel form. I hope SAM.Gov. does not replace this and if it does, it should be as clear and simple to use the same function as in FPDS. Is this possible?	We will not be discussing any changes to FPDS at this time.
Assume that usaspending.gov will still be utilized? What will be the lag time of the data from beta.sam.gov?	USASpending.gov updates with FPDS-NG data on a nightly basis.
Where is the feedback tool?	In the new design, the feedback tool is found at the bottom of the page.
Will the date on fpds.gov still be available and updated?	FPDS.gov will remain where it is. It is not integrating into SAM.gov at this time.
Will there be an EZ Search similar to what was in FPDS? This feature is great when doing a quick search or check. If this feature is not in the new design, will it be incorporated at a later time?	FPDS.gov will be integrated at a future date.

Please confirm that the final product will be called SAM.gov and not beta.SAM.gov	Yes, when SAM.gov functionality is merged with beta.SAM.gov , the site will be called SAM.gov
Do you have a one-pager that we can provide to our contracting staff with the date of the migration and design changes, etc? Will past contracts be loaded in the new system? they are great for reference	FPDS.gov remains the official source of contract data. Only contract data reports are found at beta.SAM.gov .
The Old FPDS is so easy to use and export data.	FPDS.gov is not migrating to this new platform at this time. For contract data search, FPDS.gov remains the official source. Contract data reports are at beta.SAM.gov .
Will our saved searches in the Contract Opportunities function be preserved during the transition?	There will be no change to your saved searches in beta.SAM.gov when the design changes on April 26 or when SAM.gov is integrated on May 24.
Will there be multi factor authentication for login searches?	Login.gov requires multi-factor authentication. You are not required to be signed in beta.SAM.gov to conduct a search. You are required to be logged in to save your searches.

Some data will require signing in to search. To save searches or follow records, you must be signed in.</p>

<p>Will tracked items cross over?</p>	<p>Any saved searches or followed items in beta.SAM.gov will not change with these transitions.</p>
<p>An MS Excel file listing of current Federal agency contracting offices, department codes, agency codes, etc. used to be available via the fpbs.gov website. Will GSA consider making that periodically updated MS Excel file available from the beta.SAM.gov website?</p>	<p>You can search the federal hierarchy on beta.SAM.gov and filter by departments, sub-tiers or keywords. You can download search results in CSV or PDF formats.</p>
<p>Will we need new log-in credentials when everything is integrated?</p>	<p>You may use your existing login credentials for SAM.gov or beta.SAM.gov.</p>
<p>Can we still update our sam.gov registrations over the next few months as this transitioning takes place?</p>	<p>Yes, please continue to update your registrations on the current site until May 24, 2021. After May 24,</p>

Users will be granted access based on the roles they are assigned. Only users assigned an entity administrator role will have access to the entity registrations.
Will previous registrations carry over to new Sam.gov or will a new registration be required-perhaps due to changes?	When SAM.gov is transferred over to beta.SAM.gov, your registration information will transfer. A new registration will not be required.
Will sam.gov highlight on their landing page that this change is taking place on May 24th? With all of our phishing emails, it may be good for people to be prepared to get re-routed.	Yes, there will be a banner, but the URL for users will remain the same - SAM.gov .
Will there be a search feature for Industry events?	There is one in the Contract Opportunities area. You can also use the "industry event" Keyword/phrase

<p>Precision searches are critically important. Users may be looking for one particular project at one particular location for one particular type of contract. If a user wants to find a "Nursing for Housing" solicitation at MCB Camp Lejeune, they should be able to search for Nursing + Housing + Camp Lejeune and get ONE search result (or just a few)...not 10,000s++. The way it was explained, a user would have to search for "Nursing" first and get 400+ results. Then search for "Housing" and get another several 100 results. And then search for "Camp Lejeune" and get another long list of results. And then they would need to reconcile the three separate search results to ultimately find if their project was listed for that day. And then they need to repeat that search effort daily until the</p>	<p>At this time, the keyword search capability is based on using an "OR" operator, which means the more words or phrases you use, the more results you will get. We are working to provide an advanced search with other Boolean operators in the near future. We recommend users use the filters first and then use a keyword or phrase to get the best results.</p>

<p>My earlier question relates to secondary authentication which is a code given to someone who logs in for only 10 minutes after that the code expires.
