Project Overview

The modernization project will help CBP to more efficiently carry out its agency mission at the international border crossing between Fort Fairfield, Maine, and Carlingford, New Brunswick. These upgrades will accommodate the current technologies and equipment utilized by CBP, and will allow for enhanced traffic management and flow.

Current Status

The CMa solicitation is in progress with an award expected in February of 2023. The CMa will assist with the preparation of a design build requirements package. A National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) contractor was awarded a task order to study the proposed action in December 2022.



The Bipartisan Infrastructure Law includes \$3.4 billion for GSA to modernize and construct land ports of entry along the nation's borders. These projects will strengthen supply chains, create good-paying jobs, enhance safety and security, and serve as models of sustainability.
