Time Capsule Installation Set for Tuesday (Aug. 19) at Burger U.S. Courthouse

The U.S. General Services Administration and the U.S. District Court will install a time capsule in the lobby of the Warren E. Burger Federal Building & United States Courthouse in St. Paul at 2 p.m. on Tuesday, August 19.

The time capsule, to be opened in 2067 as St. Paul celebrates the building's centennial, will contain mementoes and newsworthy items from 2008 in order to capture this moment in time and share these items and the historical significance they represent with future generations.

The time capsule items will be on display at the courthouse on Tuesday afternoon and include paraphernalia from the Presidential campaigns, important news stories from 2008, a fact sheet on the soon-to-be completed renovation project of the courthouse, and a map drawn by former Chief Justice Burger when he was a student at St. Paul's John A. Johnson High School.
