GSA Coordinates Donation Transfer to New Jersey State Police *Used Generator Gets a Second Life in Brick Township*

PHILADELPHIA – The U.S. General Services Administration (GSA) in partnership with the New Jersey State Agency for Surplus Property recently coordinated the donation of a 500KW diesel powered generator to the New Jersey State Police. The generator is valued at \$150,000 and will be used by the Brick Township Police Office of Emergency Management at a local high school which is used as a shelter for evacuees during flooding or other emergencies.

As a result of building systems improvements to the Clarkson S. Fisher Federal Courthouse in Trenton, NJ, GSA has upgraded the building's generator with a more efficient, higher capacity model. The donation of the courthouse's original generator is made possible through GSA's Federal Surplus Personal Property Donation Program, which enables certain nonfederal organizations to obtain personal property that the federal government no longer needs.

"The donation of this generator is a wonderful example of how federal, state and local governments can work together to assist the local community, while saving taxpayers significant dollars," said Linda Chero, GSA Acting Regional Administrator and Federal Acquisition Service Regional Commissioner.
