Benefits of Reducing Emissions and Climate Risks in the Master Contract



Reducing Supplier Emissions: Post-award Deliverables

To understand and reduce the energy and environmental impacts of products and services, large contractors for certain acquisitions may be required to submit the following as a postaward deliverable:

- GHG inventory (scope 3 optional)
- GHG reduction target
- GHG reduction target progress

Reducing Supplier Emissions: Preaward Evaluation Factors

For certain acquisitions, offerors may be given the opportunity to achieve points in the pre-award phase for certain achievements. EXAMPLE:

- One point for -
 - Publicly disclosing scope 1 and 2 GHG emissions
- One point for any of the following -
 - Publicly disclosing scope 3 GHG emissions
 - Publicly disclosing science-based reduction target
 - Certification to relevant multi-attribute standard (e.g., ANSI 391.1)

Managing Climate Risk: Post-award Deliverables

- What is your process for identifying, assessing, and responding to climate-related risks for successful performance or delivery
- What inherent climate-related risks have you identified that may have a substantive financial or strategic impact on your business?
- What is your business continuity plan?

FAS FY23 Climate and Sustainability Priorities

- Acquisition support
 - Integrate GHG and climate risk requirements in new, major FAS acquisitions
 - Support FAS acquisition teams administer GHG and climate risk contract requirements
- Invite major FAS contractors to voluntarily disclose to CDP
- Develop and roll-out federal-wide climate and sustainability training
- Develop a supplier climate risk plan template
- Continue leading an internal FAS sustainability workgroup
- Update the Green Procurement Compilation
- Monitor effectiveness of the Verified Products Portal
