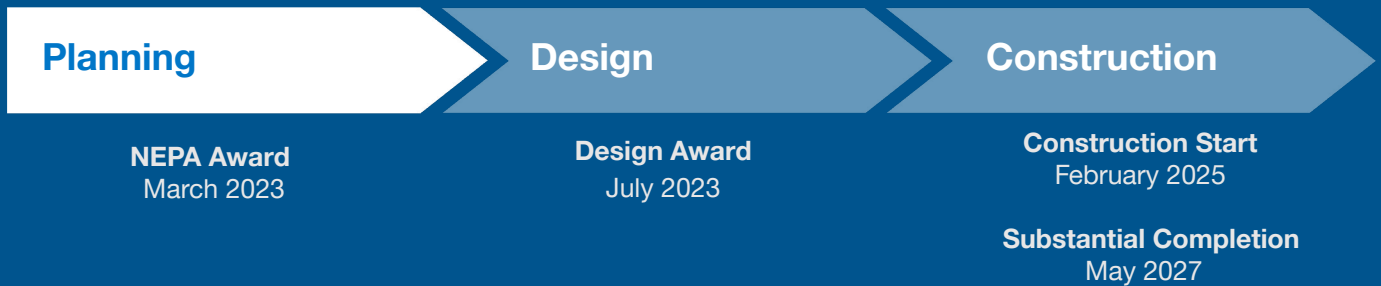
Project Overview

The project will fully renovate the interior of the historic building to help meet the mission of CBP. This will include, but is not limited to, full interior renovation, mechanical, electrical and plumbing utilities. Exterior upgrades to include minor site work, inspection booth, gates, and lane work.

Current Status

A Design Statement of Work is being developed for the renovations and alterations to the existing Historic Main Port Building. The acquisition process to bring on a contractor to perform the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) process is underway with an anticipated award in March of 2023.

Project Timeline



The Bipartisan Infrastructure Law includes \$3.4 billion for GSA to modernize and construct land ports of entry along the nation's borders. These projects will strengthen supply chains, create good-paying jobs, enhance safety and security, and serve as models of sustainability.
