Project Overview

The project will expand the historical port with a multi-story addition while preserving the historical character of the original structure. The expansion will increase the inspection and operational capabilities, and modernize the LPOE with an updated Customs and Border Protection (CBP) program of requirements and security measures. Program highlights include a new canopy with additional inspection lanes and new booths, new parking facilities, additional offices, and upgrades to the interiors of the historic port structure.

Current Status

An architect-engineering (A/E) award was made to Morphosis Architects in April 2023. Jacobs Technologies was awarded the Construction Manager as Advisor (CMa) contract in September 2023. Phase II of the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) study is underway and is expected to be completed by Winter 2025.
