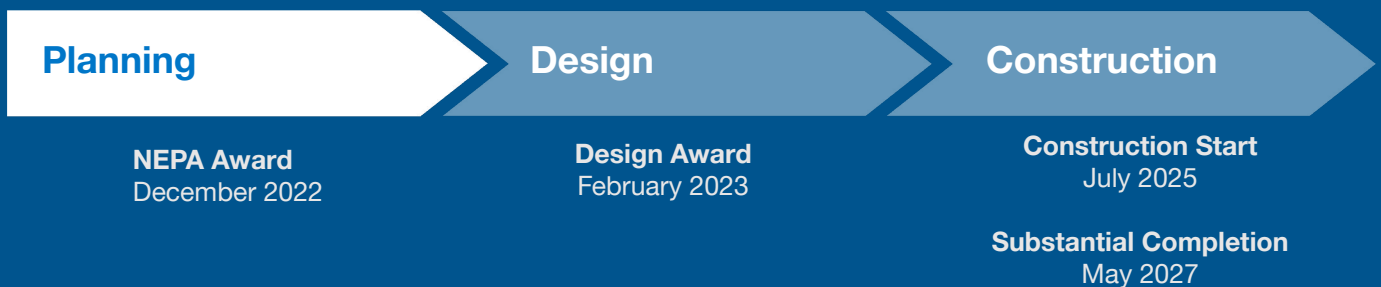
Project Overview

The project will expand the historical port with a multi-story addition while preserving the historical character of the original structure. The expansion will increase the inspection and operational capabilities, as well as modernize the LPOE with updated Customs and Border Protection (CBP) program of requirements and security measures. Program highlights include new canopy with additional inspection lanes and new booths, new parking facilities, additional offices, and upgrade to the interiors of the historic port structure.

Current Status

An AE is expected to be awarded February 2023. The National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) contract was awarded in December of 2022.

Project Timeline



The Bipartisan Infrastructure Law includes \$3.4 billion for GSA to modernize and construct land ports of entry along the nation's borders. These projects will strengthen supply chains, create good-paying jobs, enhance safety and security, and serve as models of sustainability.
