Washington DC



Constructed in 1917 to serve as the headquarters for the Department of Interior, this historic building pioneered a new model of utilitarian government office building. Neither factory nor monumental office, the building served as a model for many government office buildings in the early 20th century and is considered by many the first truly modern government office building.
