A suite of governmentwide, multi-award IDIQ contracts designed to support Federal agency procurement requirements for a full range of non-IT, services-based requirements.

The scope of each contract vehicle is categorized into “functional groupings” known as **DOMAINs**.

How is **OASIS+** structured?

OASIS+ Unique Features

- Vetted **highly-qualified** contractors
- Flexible, expandable **domain-based** structure
- **10-year order period** (base of five-year and one five-year option period)
- Maximizes **small business** participation
- **NO** contract dollar ceiling & **NO** cap on awards
- All contract types for **commercial** and **non-commercial** services acquisitions
- Open contract with **continuous on-ramping**
- FAR Subpart 16.505 **streamlined acquisition procedure**

OASIS+ Category Management

- OASIS+ has been designated as a Tier III, Best-in-Class (BIC) contract by the Office of Management and Budget (OMB)
- The term BIC is a contracting and acquisition designation used to denote contracts that meet rigorous category management performance criteria as defined by OMB.
- It is a preferred governmentwide solution
- Key BIC evaluation criteria include demonstrated use of category and performance management strategies and third-party validation

OASIS+ Value Proposition

- By using OASIS+, federal agencies can focus on their expertise & mission while GSA delivers program management & contract administration at the master contract level
- OASIS+ provides complete control to structure, award & administer task orders
- Reduces lead time & administrative effort to acquire complex professional service-based requirements
- Designed for a long period of use; task orders can be awarded through 2029 (2034 after OASIS+ Option Exercise) with performance extending up to five years and six months beyond the end of the ordering period.

OASIS+ Value Proposition

- No maximum order or ceiling limitations
- Allows for ancillary support components, commonly referred to as Other Direct Costs (ODCs), at the task order level
- Supports a significant IT component with no cap, as long as the primary NAICs is not IT

- Hold due-diligence or pre-solicitation meetings
- Use streamlined evaluation methodologies
- Use multi-phase or advisory multi-step technique
- Use oral presentations
- Perform comparative analysis
- Tell what-you-are-going-to-do & do it
- Award on initial responses

Ordering Procedures

Streamlined Acquisition Procedures

- FAR 16.505 - Streamlined acquisition procedures keeps it simple
 - Proposals should have only the minimum necessary discriminators to verify Offerors' understanding of the requirement & to quickly enable the Government to determine the awardee.
 - Offers the ordering contracting offer broad discretion in developing task order placement procedures
- FAR 15.3 - Source selection procedures are not applicable under FAR 16.505
 - No synopsis or posting solicitations on Sam.gov
 - No FAR 9.1 responsibility determination for each order (it's already completed at the IDIQ level)

Does OASIS+ support Direct Awards?

Answer: YES! Sole Source/ Direct 8(a) Orders

- Sole Source (Direct) 8(a) Orders may be issued at the OCO's discretion subject to SBA approval. Every direct order must each be offered to and accepted by SBA before the award is made.
- A firm must be a current 8(a) participant at the time of task order award in order to receive a Sole Source (Direct) order. The OCO should check the 8(a) status at SBA Dynamic Search website before considering a Sole Source (Direct) order
- Contractors who have exited from the 8(a) program are ineligible to receive an 8(a) Sole Source (Direct) order award
- The current 8(a) Sole Source (Direct) order limit is \$4.5 million, per FAR 19.805-1(a)(2)
 - Except for 8(a) concerns owned by an Indian Tribe (Tribal Owned) or an Alaska Native Corporation (ANC) (reference FAR 19.805- 1(b)(2)) which have a Sole Source(Direct) order limit of \$25 million in accordance with FAR 19.808-1.

A note about Blanket Purchase Agreements (BPAs)

Per RFO Guidance, OASIS+ now permits BPAs. [RFO 16.507-2\(c\)\(3\)](#)

For BPAs awarded to **8(a)s**, offer and acceptance must occur at the BPA level and is **not covered** by the master contract.

RFO 19.108-6 Basic ordering agreements and blanket purchase agreements:

- The contracting office must submit an offering letter for, and SBA must accept, each order under a basic ordering agreement (BOA) or a blanket purchase agreement (BPA) (see 12.201-1), in addition to the agency offering and SBA accepting the BOA or BPA itself.
- SBA will not accept for award on a sole-source basis any order that would cause the total dollar amount of orders issued under a specific BOA or BPA to exceed the competitive threshold amount in 19.108-7.
- Once an 8(a) participant's program term expires, the participant otherwise exits the 8(a) program, or becomes other than small for the NAICS code assigned under the BOA or the BPA, SBA will not accept new orders under the BOA or BPA for the participant.

How flexible is OASIS+?

The Ordering Contracting Officer has the control.

- Ordering CO determines:
 - Terms & conditions and/or provisions & clauses
 - Evaluation criteria
 - Method of award (in accordance with FAR 16.5)
- All required & applicable FAR matrix clauses automatically apply to each order per contract
Section I.1 Task Order Clauses:
 - Ordering CO must include FAR provisions/clauses needing fill-ins by full text
 - Ordering CO must include any optional FAR and/or agency specific provisions/clauses needed (e.g. DFARS for DoD)

OASIS+ Delegation of Procurement Authority (DPA) training

- Ordering Contracting Officers (OCOs) must obtain a DPA prior to issuing task order solicitations under the OASIS+ Contract Vehicle. Ordering Contract Specialists assisting with solicitations in the OASIS+ task order management system must also attend DPA training. To obtain a DPA, the OCO must:
 - Attend OASIS+ DPA Training
 - Be a warranted Federal Contracting Officer per FAR 2.101
 - Formally apply for a DPA by providing the OCO Warrant Number and DPA Training certificate to GSA
- Live OASIS+ DPA Training registration is available on OASIS+ website ([Events and Training](#))
- On Demand DPA Training is available through DAU/FAI CSOD under FAC 154
- OASIS+ DPA Training also includes the link to the published [OASIS+ Ordering Guide](#) available on the OASIS+ website

OASIS+ offers an optional pre-award scope review that analyzes the scope and Domain/NAICS assignment of your proposed requirement:

- Choose an OASIS+ Domain & NAICS code for your requirement
- Include your Statement of Work (SOW) & Independent Government Cost Estimate (IGCE) or the GSA Price Estimating Tool
- General turnaround time is 48-72 hours depending on the complexity
