


1794 Whiskey Rebellion: Topic of first Federal Advisory Committee

The Committee's Statutory Mission

- Created by Energy Independence & Security Act of 2007 (EISA):
 - "The Committee shall provide advice and expertise for use by the Federal Director in carrying out the duties under this subtitle"
 - Advises GSA Office of Federal High-Performance Green Buildings on fulfillment of our mission:
 - To advance federal building innovations in planning, design, and operations to reduce costs, enable agency missions, enhance human health and performance, and minimize environmental impacts.

FACA: The Guardrails

- ➤ Federal Advisory Committee Act of 1972 (FACA):
 - Membership limited to the specific individuals appointed by the GSA Administrator
 - Avoid conflicts of interest:
 - Avoid even appearance of impropriety
 - Maintain transparency & independence:
 - No "smoke-filled rooms"
 - All meetings open to public, announced in Federal Register
 - Committee materials posted at gsa.gov/gbac



New Committee Topics and Directions

GBAC Topics – Next Steps

- Federal Building Decarbonization Task Group, Phase III will start in December with a focus on electrification
- We hope to be able to support additional GBAC work (assuming staff/resource capability)
- Task Groups have worked great, but not the only model:
 - Also workshops, town hall meetings, etc.

GBAC Topics – Suggested Criteria

- What, if any, is the market failure that needs to be addressed?
- Is the proposed solution likely to have a substantial impact?
- Is this a problem appropriate for the Federal government to attempt to solve?
- Are the benefits of such a proposal likely to outweigh its costs over a reasonable time horizon?
- Plus: level of interest, timing, scope
