Project Overview

The Grand Portage LPOE is located on Highway 61 approximately 1,000 feet from the U.S./Canada border and five miles northeast of the town of Grand Portage, Minnesota. The new 30,678 square-foot facility is the only port of entry in this LPOE Program located wholly on Tribal Land. The project entails demolishing the existing functionally obsolete facility and replacing it with a new facility. The project will be multi-phased to ensure the port remains operational during the construction of the new facility.

Current Status

A public scoping meeting was held on Oct. 5, 2023, in support of the development of the Draft Environmental Impact Statement to address the expansion and modernization of the Land Port of Entry project planned in Grand Portage, Minnesota. GSA hosted an industry day event on Oct. 18, 2023, where participants provided industry feedback concerning phasing, scheduling, task challenges, supply chain forecasting issues, and acquisition strategy.



The Bipartisan Infrastructure Law includes \$3.4 billion for GSA to modernize and construct land ports of entry along the nation's borders. These projects will strengthen supply chains, create good-paying jobs, enhance safety and security, and serve as models of sustainability.
