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Repair & Alterations IDIQ

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- What is an IDIQ?
- Indefinite Delivery Indefinite Quantity Contract
 - Umbrella Contract under which task orders are placed (no set amount in terms of number of orders or value)
 - Can be one or multiple contractors
 - Orders to the contractors are placed pursuant to ordering procedures established in the IDIQ contract

Customer Projects (Regionwide) R&A IDIQ

- 25 Contractors
- Set aside for small businesses
- 6 zones one for each state in the region (IL, IN, MI, MN, OH, WI)
- Each contractor's IDIQ contract includes at least one and up to all six zones
- Duration: 1 base year and 4 option years
- \$7m annual maximum per contract
- Individual orders have ranged from \$25K to \$3m

- IDIQ Procurement Process
 - SAM.gov Where opportunities are posted
 - Solicitation includes a scope of work, description of evaluation factors, contractual terms (Agreement) and forms.
 - Evaluation Factors considered in determining best value to the Government.

Price (line item prices for specific SOWs, OH & P) Past performance (references for completed projects) Experience (completed projects)

Key Personnel (Project Managers, Superintendents)



Post Award -Ordering Procedures

- A request for quote (RFQ) is typically shared with the IDIQ contractors whose contract includes the zone where the work will occur.
- Award for a task order is made based on factors established in the RFQ (price, past performance, etc.)
